

As you may recall, LIS made a \$100.00 donation to the Median Iris Society this spring. The Median Iris Society was to ship LIS two Paul Black 2015 introductions that Paul donated in support of the Median Iris Society. <u>Fall Clean Up Reminder</u>

Now is the time to thoroughly clean your iris beds of dead foliage, leave and miscellaneous trash that may have blown in. The nocturnal moth that lays eggs in material that has accumulated around iris rhizomes is now active. These eggs will over winter, hatch in the spring, and become iris borers that can destroy your beautiful iris by eating the interior of the rhizome. Removal of debris is a good practice in borer control by denying the moth its preferred nesting material for its eggs. diligence during the fall in keeping iris beds clean and a thorough cleaning again in the spring will be very beneficial in the control of iris borers in your garden. In the spring, two consecutive days of 70 degrees or warmers will cause the eggs laid in the previous fall to hatch. Clean beds are essential to borer control plus they are much more attractive.
