After reseating them, I used the cane to tamp the earth gently down around the rhizome. I have had to do this in past years and it seems to benefit the rhizome by securing it firmly without damage. I was pleased to see our gardens were fairly clean with just a few blown in leaves around the plants. I will clean the gardens as soon as possible as borers begin their cycle by hatching in trash around the rhizomes.
